Pickle Ball Court Guidelines

Rotation Play

Since Pickle Ball does not allow court reservations a rotation system is always in place.

Meaning once a game is finished, *all four players* on your court must rotate off the court to allow waiting players to play. Simply put your paddle into the Rack to indicate you are waiting to play. The Paddle Rack is determined to tell who is next to play and rotates from silver to the gold side as designated by the red marker which switches to the opposite side each time a court is taken by the next four players waiting.

If a court is not available when you arrive, place your paddle on either side to wait for a court. This rotation applies to *both* Organized Play and Drop-In Play.

Organized Play vs. Drop-In Play

Organized Play you play with specific people. Drop-In Play allows you to play when a spot is available. The hours for each type of play are as follows:

Drop-In Play: M/W/F/Sat: 9-11 a.m. & Wed: 4-7 p.m. **Organized Play:** M/W/F/Sat: 8-9 a.m. & 11 a.m.-7 p.m.

Wed: 8-9 a.m. & 11 a.m.-4 p.m. T/Th: 8 a.m.-7 p.m.

Sun: 11 a.m.-3 p.m.

Organized Play

If you want to play with specific people come during Organized Play. You arrange to meet with players of your choice. Once you have played a game you still need to rotate off if others are waiting to play.

Put your group's four paddles on the side that will allow you to play soonest. When it's your group's turn you can play together again for another game, but you will still rotate off at the end of each game played.

You can play with the same four individuals the entire time and others should not expect to become a part of your group.

Drop-In Play

Drop-In Play is designed to allow anyone of any level to play and mixes players each time a court becomes available. After each game, all four players rotate off and put their paddles in the Rack to wait for a court. Put your paddle on the gold side of the Rack if you won and put your paddles on the silver side of the Rack if you lost.

If you want to play with a guest or specific partners/people play during Organized Play hours. Drop-In players are separated based on who won.
